# **Chairpersons Introduction**



On behalf of Lanarkshire Carers Centre Board of Directors, I would like to present you with our annual report for the financial year 2017-2018. I would like to thank each and every member of staff, volunteer, and board member for their hard work and dedication, without whom Lanarkshire Carers Centre simply would not exist and certainly would not be the success it is today. I would also like to thank every carer involved with our organisation, by accessing our services and contributing, you help develop and shape our work.

It has been a busy and challenging year. The implementation of the Carers (Scotland) Act 2016 extends and enhances the rights of carers in Scotland and aims to help improve their health and wellbeing, so that they can continue to care, if they so wish, and have a life alongside caring.

Lanarkshire Carers Centre has been at the forefront of supporting North and South Lanarkshire Local Authorities to develop the key duties they have as a result of the legislation. This work has included the development of Local Eligibility Criteria and Adult Carer Support Plans, which have replaced Carers Assessments and Carer Journeys. We have also contributed to the development of Short Breaks Service Statements.

Lanarkshire Carers Centre has achieved national recognition through an external assessment showing we are fit for purpose. The National Council for Voluntary Organisations scrutinised our work and quality standards through a recognised framework of assurance called PQASSO (Practical Quality Assurance System for Small Organisations). We previously held this at Level 1 and in December 2017 achieved Level 2. We are now one of a very small number of carer centres in Scotland to have reached this level. Carers can be confident that they are supported by a quality organisation.

We are currently facing our biggest challenge to date. Following a period of consultation and review in 2017, North Lanarkshire Health and Social Care Partnership took the decision to put carer services out to open competitive tender. The result of this process will determine who will be delivering carer services across North Lanarkshire from March 2019 onwards. Lanarkshire Carers Centre is working tirelessly to ensure our quality approved, user led organisation continues to be at the forefront of services for carers following the tender process.

This report highlights some of the operational highlights for the year demonstrating the hard work of our staff and volunteers working with and for carers to achieve outcomes that enable them to continue caring.

I hope that you find this report interesting and informative and I look forward to your continued support over the coming years.








Most carers find out about Lanarkshire Carers Centre from other carers and get in touch directly by visiting us, calling us or contacting us online. outreach work in localities Lanarkshire further improves this access to information, advice and support that we know makes a difference to carers. Through our effective partnership working some carers are also signposted and referred to us by other organisations. Our relationships with social work, health and voluntary sector colleagues helps ensure that the needs of more carers are met. By working together, we ensure appropriate support is provided throughout the caring journey.

#### New carers in the last 5 years:



The team at Lanarkshire Carers Centre has many years' experience of having meaningful conversations with carers, discussing the caring role and what is important to each individual, their aims and hopes. Through these conversations outcomes are agreed and a plan is put in place to meet identified needs.



The Carers (Scotland) Act 2016 means that all carers now have the right to an Adult Carer Support Plan. The experience of our organisation in this work has meant that we are recognised as key local delivery partners.

Each individual Adult Carer Support Plan can identify several outcomes important to the carer. Outcomes relating to Coping with Caring Role and Carers Health and Wellbeing feature most frequently. Access to our range of services can effectively address many of the outcomes agreed. Our capacity to support carers to access short breaks, make social and community connections and further develop their confidence and skills is very important. We provide regular case studies to evidence this impact and help develop our practice further. An example of an outcomes-based approach to carer support can be found on pg 13 of our 2018-2019 newsletter. It is important to acknowledge that a caring role can change over time and we understand the importance of ongoing support and regular opportunities to review the support needs of carers.










Lanarkshire Carers Centre has been integral to the preparation for implementation of the Carers (Scotland) Act 2016 in North and South Lanarkshire. Our work and experience has been recognised and valued. Our service delivery model has been incorporated into the guidance and practice used by both Health and Social Care Partnerships. The co-location of Lanarkshire Carers Centre staff with our key partners further strengthens the capacity to identify and support carers effectively.



# Carers attended training opportunities

Throughout the year we have delivered a comprehensive, innovative, varied, and carer led training programme. Feedback from over 400 completed training needs analysis forms help develop the programme. Over 500 individual comments and suggestions from carers at groups and at existing training sessions have also informed this work along with suggestions from individual carers who contact us.



Some of the most popular courses this year have been the newly introduced Laughter Club, the Physicare Moving and Handling group and one to one sessions, Art Therapy, Tai Chi, Dementia-Carers Education, Autism focused sessions, Mindfulness, Caring at Christmas and Certificated First Aid. We are always keen and open to look at new ways of informing and educating carers to enable them to carry out the challenges of a caring role with a bit more ease. The training programmes have not only given carers this expert knowledge but have also been a place for people to meet and discuss their caring role in a safe and welcoming environment.



#### How carers engaged with us/how we engaged with them:



Lanarkshire Carers Centre delivers services throughout North and South Lanarkshire. We have our main centre in Hamilton, along with our Airdrie base and staff co-located in each locality. Our services are delivered in locations, venues and times to meet the needs of carers. We have worked in this way for many years and our experience fits well with the current agenda of establishing and developing community hubs. Opportunities to further enhance our outreach activity is always welcomed.

Lanarkshire Carers Centre is extremely proud of the positive and productive working relationships we have with our many partners throughout North and South Lanarkshire.

Our partners add value to our carer training programme. For example, we worked collaboratively with Alzheimer's Scotland's North and South Lanarkshire teams to deliver 'Dementia Carers Education' sessions. These were held in numerous locations throughout Lanarkshire and have been a great success, providing positive experiences for both carers and the person they care for. Our partnership with New Law Solicitors ensures that carers can have access to a free 20 minute consultation with a solicitor to discuss legal issues relating to their caring role. Our partnership with the NHS Keep Well team ensures carers can access a free 30 minute health check with a Keep Well nurse. Our partnership with independent providers delivers carers foot clinics and therapy sessions across Lanarkshire and the number of partners participating in our Carers Registration Card scheme continues to grow.

#### **Treasurers Remarks**

The statutory accounts once again show a healthy set of figures with overall income having increased from £806,340 in 2016/17 to £883,589 in 2017/18 and a net inflow of resources of £131,352 for the year, compared to a net inflow of resources of £21,184 in the previous year.

The rise in net inflow of income was due in the most part to Carers Act Implementation funding, which was designed to ensure that Lanarkshire Carers Centre was and is ready to face the challenges posed by the Carers (Scotland) Act 2016. This funding has allowed us to invest in various measures to build capacity in meeting the demands of the Act and has certainly helped to bridge the gap in funding caused by the NHS Lanarkshire spending review which impacted on our core and CISG funding in the previous financial year.

This past year has been a year of consolidation, where our attention to carer services have been very much outcome focused. We have tried to ensure that our services deliver the best support, the best training opportunities, the best short break opportunities, that our resources enable us to provide to carers. Once again, we secured the largest Creative Break Time to Live grant awarded in Scotland. This has allowed us to continue to provide grants to more carers than ever before, helping carers to take a break from their caring roles.

Health and Social Care carer services in North Lanarkshire are currently being prepared for a tendering process which is expected to come to a conclusion in the 2018/19 financial year. Any tendering process causes some anxiety due to the uncertainty involved in the outcome of these processes. At Lanarkshire Carers Centre, we are confident that our historical ability to deliver and improve upon carer services across Lanarkshire, stretching over a period of more than 20 years, will be capably demonstrated during the tendering process and lead to a successful outcome for both Lanarkshire Carers Centre and carers throughout Lanarkshire.

My thanks go once again to all of our main funding partners for their continued support throughout the year and also to the many individuals who provide not only financial support to Lanarkshire Carers Centre, but also by donating their own time in volunteering activities.

A copy of the Statement of Financial Activities for the Year Ended 31 March 2018 from the DRAFT audited accounts has been included for reference. A full copy of the detailed audited accounts will be available from the office by request and will also be available shortly after the AGM for download from our website www.lanarkshirecarerscentre.org.uk.

#### Incoming / (Outgoing) Resources

Total net incoming resources in the year totalled £131,352.

Net incoming resources to the Restricted Fund (projects run by Lanarkshire Carers Centre) totalled £10,619 and there was a net inflow of funds into our Unrestricted Fund of £120,733

#### Income

Overall income in this financial year increased to £883,589 in 2017/18 from £806,340 in 2016/17.

#### **Resources Expended**

Charitable Expenditure in the 2017/18 financial year actually decreased to £650,337 from £697,705 in the previous year. Timing differences in the lifespan of different projects can affect the amount of resources expended in any particular financial year and in the 2017/18 year, the income for the Carers Act Implementation funding, was received quite late on in the year. This funding will be continue to be spent throughout the 2018/19 financial year.

Governance costs increased to £101,900 from £87,451 in the previous year. Almost all areas of our overheads have gone up in cost in the past year, but additional pension auto enrolment costs, Employers NIC contributions, PQASSO level 2 Certification Costs (legal and professional costs), carer celebration events have been the source for the majority of the increase in overheads expenditure.

#### **Funds Carried Forward**

Unrestricted Funds carried forward amounted to £150,064 Restricted Funds carried forward amounted to £338,384 Overall Funds carried forward amounted to £488,448

These funds provide the financial support and strength, to enable us to carry on providing the services that we offer and to build upon those services in the future.
